The appointee will provide support to the project entitled "Jockey Club Sports Empowering Programme". This project is a 3-year project which aims to promote a motivational encouraging environment for youth to enjoy sports participation. The project will also be carried out collaboratively with five sports associations to promote the character development of youth through their engagement in community sports.

Reporting to the Principal Investigator and Co-Investigators, the appointee is expected to communicate and collaborate effectively with other stakeholders and project teams to facilitate project implementation. The appointee will be responsible for (a) collecting and analyzing data, and compiling an internal database, and project reports; (b) organizing workshops, annual events, and others; (c) providing general support to the project teams; and (d) performing other administrative duties as assigned. The initial appointment will be up to around 5 months, with the possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement.

Applicants should have a Bachelor's degree in Physical Education, and preferably a Master's Degree in Sports Science, Psychology or related fields; several years' relevant experience, preferably in the tertiary education field or non-profit organizations; a strong command of both written and spoken English and Chinese; strong interpersonal, communication and organizational skills; a good knowledge and understanding of sports coaching; the ability to work independently under pressure; and a self-motivated, honest, steady and mature attitude with good work ethics. Previous full-time working experience in programming and/or research projects will be an advantage.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. Fringe benefits include leave and outpatient medical benefits.
