

Scientific Officer (Ref: 2400212) University Research Facility of Human Behavioral Neuroscience

The appointee will be responsible for supervising, maintaining and upholding the smooth running of the university research facilities (URFs), including but not limited to the University Research Facility of Human Behavioral Neuroscience (UHBN) and University Research Facility of Data Science and Artificial Intelligence (UDSAI). He/She will be responsible for training research personnel in the operation of various equipment in the URFs; providing technical and research support in related research areas; operating and maintaining website and equipment booking system; planning and monitoring the environmental and occupational health and safety of the URFs; coordinating meetings and research activities, and performing any other duties assigned by the Directors of UHBN/UDSAI and his delegate(s). The appointment will be for a period of two years with the possibility of renewal subject to work performance and funding availability.

Applicants should have a Master's degree or above in psychological or cognitive science covering neuropsychology, neurophysiology, or related disciplines such as biomedical engineering plus three years' post-qualification full-time working experience. Applicants with relevant experience in the operation of EEG, NIRX fNIRS and Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation (TMS) system will be advantageous. Applicants should have an excellent command of English and Chinese; good interpersonal and organisational skills; self-initiative and the ability to work independently.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Initial appointment will be made on a fixed-term contract. Fringe benefits include the University's Voluntary Contributions to MPF Scheme or a contract-end lump sum payment (totaling up to 10% of the basic salary), leave, medical and dental benefits.
