The appointee will assist in Global Alliance of Educational Leaders and Department Heads (GAELDH) project. The appointee will be responsible for providing support to the project team led by the principal investigator, Professor Li Hui. He/she will assist in and receive training and supervision on (a) planning and conducting data collection and analysis, (b) carrying out literature review, (c) contributing to manuscript writing, and (d) performing any other duties as assigned. The appointment will be for a period of 12 months, with the possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement. The start date is negotiable, ideally 1 June 2024, or as soon as thereafter.

Applicants should have a Bachelor's degree, preferably with a Master's degree, in Neuroscience, Psychology, Early Children Education, or above in any disciplines related to child development, psychology, education, and psycholinguistics, with considerable quantitative research experience. They are expected to possess good work ethics, good communication and interpersonal skills, the ability to work independently with initiative and under pressure, a strong sense of responsibility, and proficiency in spoken and written English and Chinese.
