The appointee will assist in Exploring The Neural Correlates of Learning Coding and English Languages in Young Children: An fNIRS Study project. The appointee will be responsible for providing support to the project team led by the principal investigator, Professor Li Hui. He/she will assist in and receive training and supervision on (a) planning and conducting data collection and analysis, (b) carrying out literature review, (c) contributing to manuscript writing, and (d) performing any other duties as assigned. The appointment will be for a period of 6 months, with the possibility of renewal upon mutual agreement. The appointee is expected to commence the employment as soon as possible.

Applicants should have a Bachelor's degree, preferably with a Master's degree, in Neuroscience, Psychology, Early Children Education, or above in any disciplines related to child development, psychology, education, and psycholinguistics, with considerable quantitative research experience. They are expected to possess good work ethics, good communication and interpersonal skills, the ability to work independently with initiative and under pressure, a strong sense of responsibility, and proficiency in spoken and written English and Chinese.
