Project Title: Parent and community engagement in supporting academic and non-academic learning beyond the classroom among underprivileged young learners

[Appointment Period: 12 months]

The appointee will be responsible for conducting literature search, liaising with schools, preparing research materials, collecting data from kindergarten children and parents, entering and analyzing data, as well as preparing research reports. He/she is required to perform any other duties as assigned. The appointment will be for a period of 12 months with possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement.

Applicants should hold a bachelor's degree, preferably in Early Childhood Education, Psychology, or a related discipline. Experience working with young children will be an advantage. They should be highly motivated, responsible, adept at multi-tasking, and able to work independently under tight schedules. They should also have excellent analytical, decision-making, and interpersonal communication skills, high proficiency in both written and spoken Chinese (Cantonese) and English, strong PC skills (including MS Office and Photoshop), and experience with statistical tools (e.g., SPSS, R, or similar software).

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Initial appointment will be made on a fixed-term contract. Fringe benefits include contract-end gratuity, leave, medical and dental benefits.
