We invite applications for the position of Lecturer in Leadership in Education. The successful candidate will be instrumental in delivering high-quality teaching and contributing to the research initiatives within the master's program.

Responsibilities:

- Teach and develop courses at the master's level.
- Engage in research activities with the potential to attract external funding.
- Participate in the supervision of master's students' projects.
- Contribute to the development and continuous improvement of academic programs.
- Maintain an active role in academic advising and mentoring students.

Qualifications:

For Senior Lecturer II:

- A Master's degree in a related discipline with a minimum of 8 years of relevant post-qualification teaching or professional experience.
- Alternatively, candidates with a Doctoral degree should have at least 3 years of relevant post-qualification teaching or professional experience, along with evidence of high-quality teaching at the tertiary level.

For *Lecturer I*:

- A Master's degree in a related discipline with a minimum of 4 years of relevant post-qualification teaching experience.
- Candidates should provide evidence of quality teaching and/or a proven record of successful, relevant professional experience at the tertiary level.

For Lecturer II:

• A Master's degree in a related discipline. Applicants with less relevant post-qualification teaching experience may be considered for this position.


Applicants with publications and relevant professional teaching certificates, such as the Qualified Teacher Status recognized by the Education Bureau of Hong Kong, or other equivalent qualifications, are preferred. The successful candidate is expected to have a strong record of academic achievements and research, with excellent interpersonal and communication skills.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Initial appointment will be made on a fixed-term contract. Fringe benefits include the University's Voluntary Contributions to MPF Scheme or a contract-end lump sum payment (totaling up to 10% of the basic salary), leave, medical and dental benefits.
