The appointee will be responsible for developing and implementing projects on the career and professional development of young people (particularly in the field of Chinese medicine) in Hong Kong under Professor Stephen Wing-Kai Chiu. Duties will include analyzing large-scale qualitative and quantitative datasets, conducting interviews, organizing engagement activities in the Chinese medicine community, and help drafting reports and research manuscripts.

Applicants should have a Bachelor 's degree in Sociology or related disciplines, with knowledge of conducting quantitative analyses of large-scale dataset. He or she should have good knowledge of Hong Kong society and capable of implementing fieldwork locally. Ability to and experiences in writing academically will be an advantage. The appointee will also be occasionally required to perform duties in non-regular hours.
