The Centre for Classical Chinese Education (CCCE) is seeking inspirational and energetic candidates as Lecturer I/II to support its growing scope of learning and teaching initiatives. This is an exciting opportunity for individuals who wish to contribute to dedicated teams and advance their career in the higher education.

The Lecturer I/II will be responsible for delivering high-quality teaching for credit-bearing courses, interest classes, and programmes, with a particular emphasis on martial arts education. In addition to classroom instruction, the Lecturer I/II will lead and supervise school-based martial arts activities and related cultural immersion projects, including the planning, implementation, and evaluation of these initiatives. She/he will also perform any other duties as assigned by the Senior Management. The appointee may be required to travel outside of Hong Kong and undertake work including teaching duties as assigned by the University, where necessary.

Qualifications:

For Lecturer I:

- A Master's degree in a related discipline with a minimum of 4 years of relevant post-qualification teaching experience.
- Candidates should provide evidence of quality teaching and/or a proven record of successful, relevant professional experience at the tertiary level.

For Lecturer II:

• A Master's degree in a related discipline. Applicants with less relevant post-qualification teaching experience may be considered for this position.

Applicants with publications and relevant professional teaching certificates, such as the Qualified Teacher Status recognized by the Education Bureau of Hong Kong, or other equivalent qualifications, are preferred. The successful candidate is expected to have a strong record of academic achievements and research, with excellent interpersonal and communication skills. They should also be self-motivated, well-organised, with strong problem-solving skills, be able to work independently and collectively as a good team member and be able to work under pressure.
