Starting from August 2025, the Education University of Hong Kong will be launching a territory-wide project, cooperating with around 60 primary schools in response to the need to enhance high order reading skills (高階閱讀能力) for primary students in Hong Kong. The project aims to produce animations, design innovative learning and teaching activities, and develop other multimedia learning materials that emphasize interactions.

The appointee will be required to undertake a wide range of administrative duties, liaise with primary school teachers and different stakeholders of the project, draft project documents, translate between Chinese and English, conduct school visits, and perform other duties as assigned. The appointees will be expected to commence employment around August 2025. The appointment will be for a period of 12 months, with the possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement.

Applicants should have a Bachelor's degree, preferably in Chinese, English, Translation, Humanities, Education or related disciplines. They should have an excellent command of English and Chinese (including Cantonese), and basic computer skills.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. Fringe benefits include leave and outpatient medical benefits.
