He/she will provide guidance to students in the capacity of academic adviser/programme year leader; supervise students on teaching practice and contribute to departmental and faculty activities and management. He/she will be responsible for course design and/or improvement for new and existing programmes, integrating emerging technology and evidence-based practices. He/she will deliver professional development workshops for in-service primary school teachers, focusing on contemporary issues in English language pedagogy, such as differentiated instruction, digital literacy, and assessment for learning; and he/she will contribute to the development of PDPs that support new curriculum policy and practice and promote career-long professional learning. Applicants with local teaching experience and QTS will have an advantage.
