Project Title: The Hong Kong Jockey Club Financial Education Programme

The appointee will join the Project Team to provide a wide range of research support for a sizeable project on financial education in local primary schools. The appointee will be responsible for developing an evaluation plan and leading a small research team to implement evaluation thoroughly. This will involve task, such as identifying validated measurement tools, formulating and reviewing online questionnaire surveys and documents, using the Item Response Theory (IRT) or Classical Test Theory (CTT) method in evaluative studies, collaborating with schools for collecting data, testing, monitoring and analyzing data, and writing papers and reports, and performing other research-related duties as assigned.

Applicants should hold a Master's degree or above in a relevant field (e.g., finance, education, social sciences) and have a minimum of one year's post-master's degree full-time working experience in program evaluation, preferably in financial education or equivalent, with proven experience in using the IRT/CTT method, or a Doctoral degree in the above mentioned disciplines. Applicants should submit the curriculum vitae (CV), research statement, and references. The application materials should highlight the applicant's research experience, publications, if any, and his/her alignment with the research interests of the position.

The priority will be given to applicants with strong analytical skills, attention to details, excellent communication and report-writing abilities, able to work independently and as part of a team. dependently and as part of a team.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Initial appointment will be made on a fixed-term contract. Fringe benefits include contract-end gratuity, leave, medical and dental benefits.
