The appointee will primarily conduct and support various research projects to advance the Centre's mission in wellbeing, mental health, and special educational needs (SEN). Key research duties include conducting literature reviews, designing and implementing research protocols, recruiting, screening, and scheduling participants for studies, administering validated psychological, behavioural, or educational assessment tools, collecting and managing quantitative and qualitative data, performing statistical analysis using software such as SPSS, R, or NVivo, interpreting findings and contributing to the preparation of research outputs, and contributing to manuscript preparation for academic dissemination. Additionally, the appointee will provide administrative and operational support, including stakeholder communication, assistance in project coordination, event organization, budgeting, record management, and general Centre operations as required. The appointment will be for a period of 16 months on a fixed-term contract basis.

Applicants should possess a Master's degree in Psychology, Social Work, Counselling or a related discipline. At least one year of post-Master's relevant work experience is required, preferably in a research, academic, or social service setting. Competence in research methods, data analysis, statistical software and project management is desirable. Experience in working with SEN populations or individuals with mental health needs is preferred. Applicants must be proficient in written and spoken English and Chinese, possess good communication and organizational skills, be detail-oriented and self-motivated.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Initial appointment will be made on a fixed-term contract. Fringe benefits include contract-end gratuity, leave, medical and dental benefits.
