The appointees for Principal Lecturer (Half-time or Part-time) will be responsible for planning, developing, and implementing a new programme area on Educational Psychology. They will be assigned to teach courses, coordinate and supervise student practicums, and oversee student dissertation research projects.

For the post of Principal Lecturer, applicants should have a Master's degree in Educational Psychology plus a minimum of 15 years' relevant post-qualification teaching / professional experience; or preferably a Doctoral degree plus a minimum of 6 years' relevant post-qualification teaching / professional experience. Applicants should also possess a full membership of the Division of Educational Psychology of the Hong Kong Psychological Society or an equivalent status in an internationally recognized professional organization of Educational Psychology.

Applicants should preferably possess a relevant professional teaching certificate, e.g., PGDE or qualification of Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) recognized by the Education Bureau of Hong Kong or other qualification of equivalence. Priority will be given to those with experience in teaching professional courses at the tertiary level.
