Our research team invites applications for the post of Research Assistant I (Part-time) to support an ongoing project examining social media use and acculturation among non-local tertiary students in Hong Kong. The appointee will assist with participant recruitment, data collection and analysis, and provide related academic support as assigned by the Principal Investigator. The appointment will be for a period of six months on an hourly-paid basis, with the possibility of renewal subject to satisfactory performance and the availability of funding.

Applicants should have a Bachelor's degree (preferably a Master's degree) or be a master's degree student in Applied Linguistics, Education, Media Studies, Intercultural Communication, or a related discipline. They should demonstrate a strong command of both English and Chinese (verbal and written) and be familiar with Chinese culture and the Hong Kong context. Applicants should have strong communication and organizational skills as well as be able to work independently and collaboratively. Preference will be given to candidates with relevant research or academic experience and immediate availability.
